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Southern Grampians becomes an LDAT

The Alcohol and Drug Foundation has added 47 new Local Drug Action Teams (LDATs) to its national program to address the unique challenges of alcohol and other drugs in local communities.

The Live4Life Southern Grampians School and Community Partnership Group are pleased to announce that Southern Grampians has been successful in becoming one of these new LDATs, working together with the Southern Grampians community to build healthier, more connected and resilient communities as part of the LDAT Community.

Youth Live4Life and the Southern Grampians Live4Life partnership group have taken the lead and are in the process of developing the first Community Action Plan focussed on supporting young people aged 12-17 in addressing risks and building protective factors using the range of evidence-based approaches.

Live4Life Southern Grampians have been successful in receiving funding for Creating Connections: Live4Life Crew.

Creating connections will focus on encouraging, developing and maintaining meaningful social connections for the young people who make up the Southern Grampians Live4Life Crew.

The Crew will be supported to attend a series of events and activities, virtually and in person, which will help with personal development, encouraging ongoing social connections and strengthened relationships with their peers.

The crew volunteer their time as mental health ambassadors. sharing positive mental health messages and challenging the stigmas associated with mental ill health, help seeking and help offering.

Mental Health First Aid Training Update

Throughout 2021 Southern Grampians has enacted a number of key activities that will support the delivery of Youth and Teen Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) in schools and community now and into the future.

- Trained 3 Teen MHFA Instructors
- Trained 1 Youth MHFA Instructor and recruited another to be trained in the future
- Trained over 10% of staff in the majority of schools
- Completed Teen MHFA training in one school, commenced in another 2 and scheduling commenced with the remaining 2 schools
